RECIPE FOR BANANA CAKE CLASS 10

Ingredients: 125g butter
2 eggs
3 medium ripe bananas mashed
1/3 cup milk
½ cup brown sugar
pinch of salt
½ tsp bi-Carbonate of soda
2 cups self-raising flour sifted

Method Cream butter and sugar beat eggs in one at a time, then salt and mashed bananas. Dissolve Bi-carb of soda in milk. Add flour and milk alternately, mix well to combine. Grease and line a bar or loaf tin, and bake for 1 hour in a slow to moderate oven. When cool ice with lemon icing.

RECIPE FOR COCONUT DELIGHT CLASS 41

Ingredients: 5oz (140g) Butter/Marg
1 tab cocoa
½ cup sugar
1 dsp golden syrup
1 ½ cups SR flour
1 cup crushed cornflakes
1 cup desiccated coconut
½ teaspoon vanilla

Method: Sift flour & cocoa, add cornflakes, sugar & coconut. Melt butter & syrup, add vanilla and blend into dry ingredients. Press into greased 8" x 12" tin (20 x 30cm) & cook until light brown. Ice with chocolate icing & cut into squares.

RECIPE CINNAMON TEACAKE CLASS 50

Ingredients: 60g butter
90g sugar
1 egg
½ cup milk
150 g SR flour
Pinch salt

Topping: ½ tea softened butter 1 dsp sugar
1 tea cinnamon

Method: Beat butter & sugar to cream, then add egg and beat well. Sift flour & salt together and add to mixture alternately with milk. Mix well and pour into a greased and floured 18cm round cake tin. Bake in a moderate oven for 20 minutes. Turn onto cooler, brush the top with butter and sprinkle with a mixture of sugar & cinnamon.

Anzac biscuit recipe (Ingredients for 24 biscuits):

- 125gm butter, chopped
- 1 cup plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- ¾ cup desiccated coconut

Method:

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly.

Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

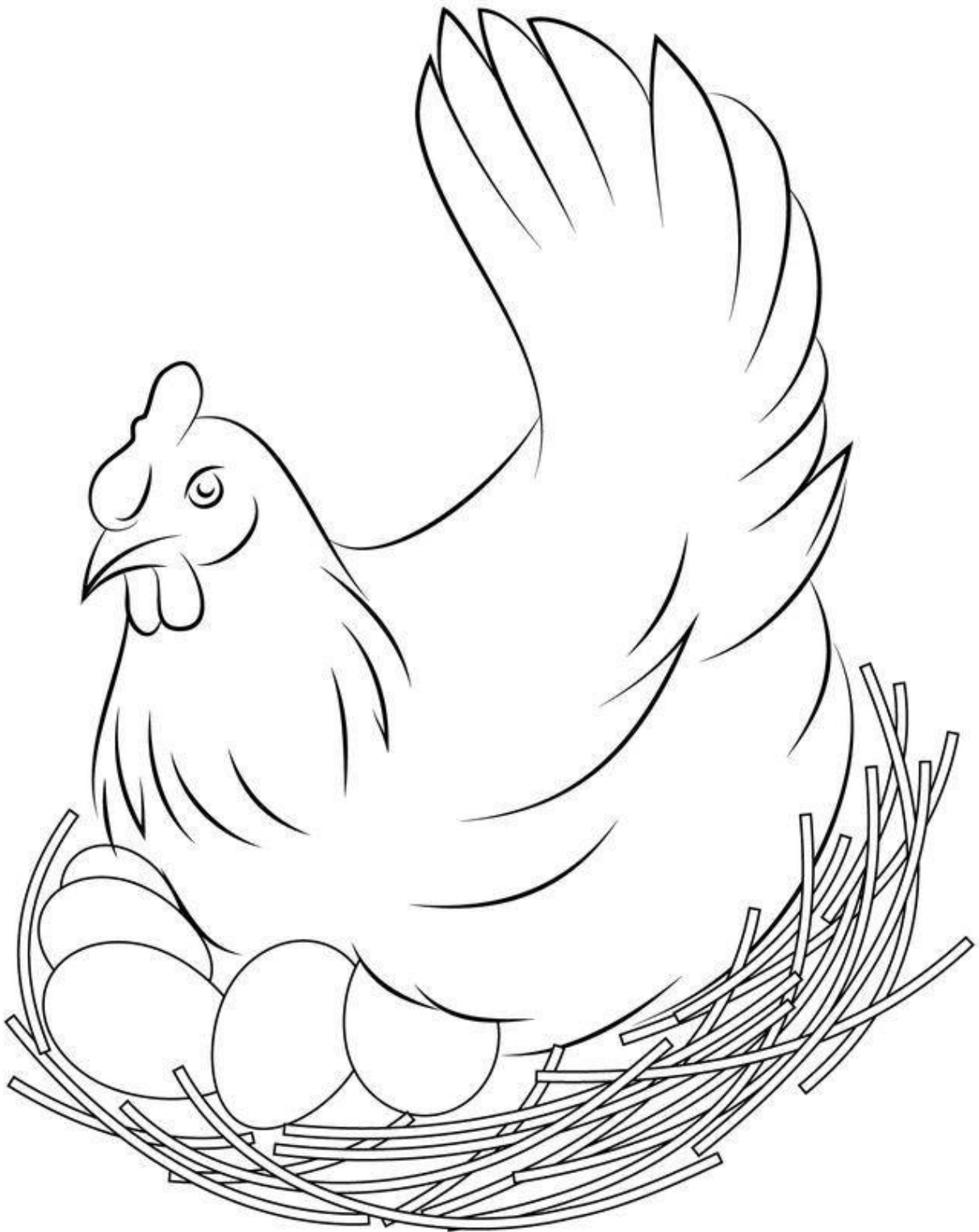

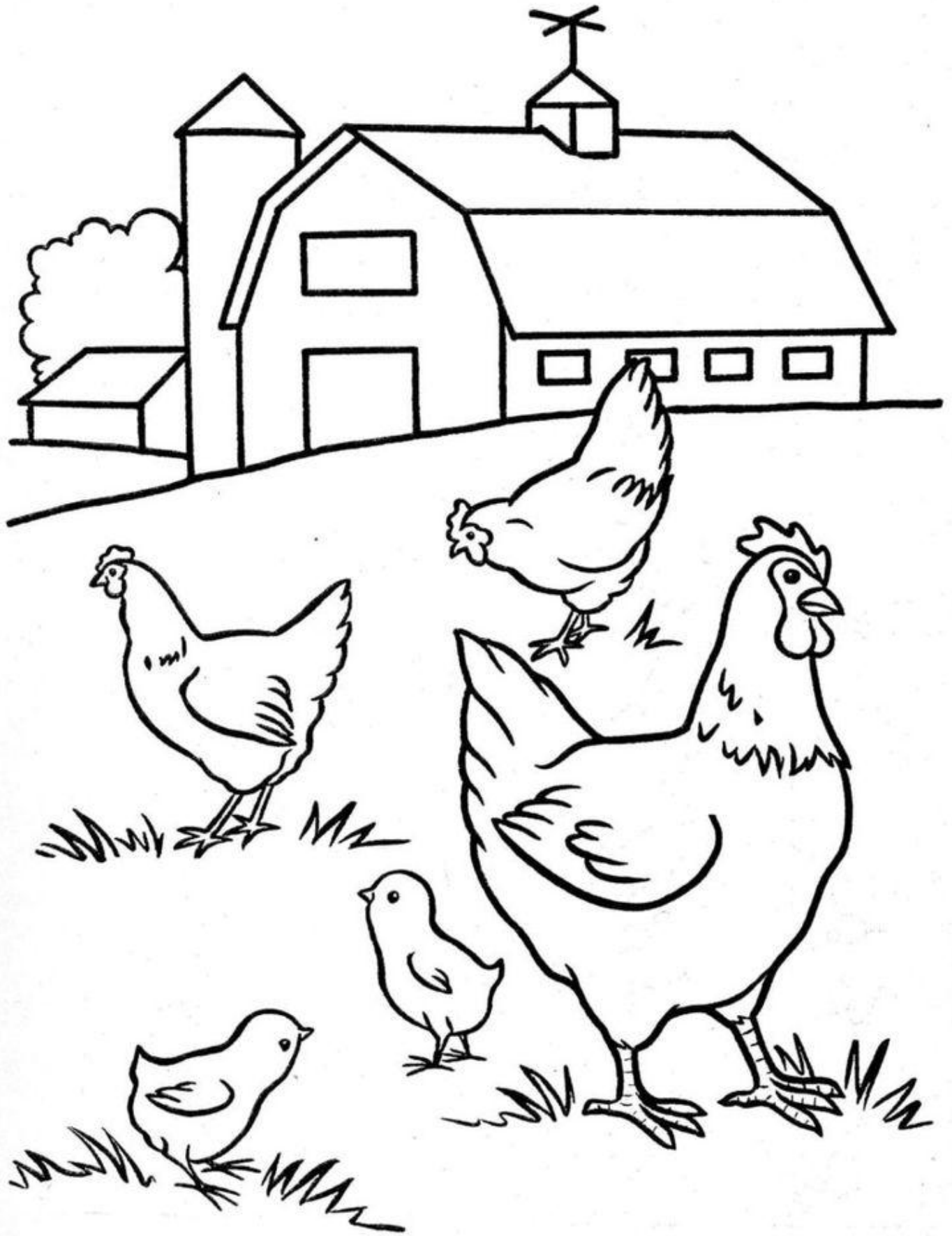
