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SHOW REGULATIONS

WONDAI SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Wondai Show is conducted subject to the Constitution and Rules of this Society and any Regulations which apply to individual sections. If any situation arises which is not covered by the Society's Constitution, Rules and Regulations, then the Constitution and Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies shall prevail.
2. The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself Responsible for any accident, loss, damage or mis-delivery of livestock or any other exhibit which may occur at any time covered by Show activity, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association blameless and indemnify it against any cost or action, legal or otherwise arising through any accident, loss, damage or mis-delivery. All care will be taken but no responsibility accepted.
3. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors and space hirers to comply with the current Workplace Health and Safety Act together with all State and Local Government Regulations.
4. **All livestock exhibitors and space hirers must have their own Public Liability Insurance** and produce certification when requested.
5. Exhibitors & space hirers who bring electrical equipment for use on the grounds must comply with all current legislation.
6. All persons entering the Showgrounds during any period covered by Society activities shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Wondai A P & I Society Inc. and will pay admission on Show Day unless issued with an approved Show Society pass or invitation.
7. The President, Steward and/or Committee person in charge of any section of the Show has the discretionary right to refuse an entry by an exhibitor or space hirer at any time, without expressing reason, if the Society reasonably believes it is necessary to do so in order to maintain the standard, quality and safety of the Show.
8. Pavilion Stewards have the right to make new classes where not listed in the schedule, provided there are two or more entries.
9. Vouchers or product to the same value can be substituted for cash prizes.
10. All competitors compete at their own risk.
11. All prize money, special prizes and ribbons are to be collected on Show Day unless prior arrangement is made with Section Steward & then within 60 days of show.
12. In order to comply with the Society's insurance requirements, **all incidents** must be reported to the Secretary who will complete an Incident Form.
13. During any period covered by Show activities, all livestock and their movement must be the responsibility of the owner or owner's representative.
14. Livestock Stewards have the right to arrange for the removal from the grounds, at the owner's expense, of any beast found to be diseased, dangerously uncontrollable or otherwise unfit for the purposes of exhibition.
15. Any objections or protests should be submitted to the Secretary in writing for consideration at the next General Committee Meeting of the Society.

**SECTION 24 LOW N' SLOW COOK OFF CONTINUED****WONDAI AP&I (WAP&I) LOW 'N SLOW COOKING RULES & REGULATIONS**

The decision & interpretations of the WAP&I rules & regulations are at the discretion of the WAP&I contest representatives at the contest. Their decisions & interpretations are final to the extent consistent with the rules.

1. Each team consists of a chief cook and as many assistants as the chief cook deems necessary. Chief cooks and/or assistant cooks may only cook for their designated team at the contest they are attending.
2. Each team will be assigned a cooking space. Pits, cookers or any other equipment shall not exceed the boundaries of the team's assigned cooking space. All seasoning & cooking of products shall be done within the assigned cooking space.
3. Contestants shall provide all needed equipment, supplies and electricity except as arranged for in advance. Contestants must adhere to all electrical, fire & other codes. A fire extinguisher must be near all cooking devices.
4. It is the responsibility of the contestant to see that the team's assigned cooking space is clean & orderly following the contest. All fires must be put out, pits filled in, (if allowed by the contest organizer), and all equipment moved from site.
5. Fires shall be of wood, wood pellets, or charcoal. Gas or electric heat sources are permitted for cooking or holding. Propane or electric are permitted as fire starters, provided the competition meat is not in/on the cooking device. Fires shall not be built on the ground.
6. Competition meat must not leave the contest site. All competition meat must start out raw. No pre-seasoning of meat is allowed. Competition meat not meeting these qualifications shall be disqualified, not allowed to be turned in, not judged & receive no score.
7. Par boiling, sous-vide and/or deep frying competition meat is not allowed. Meat shall not be sculptured, branded or presented in any way to make it identifiable.
8. Any modification of turn in times or the order the categories will be judged in must be approved by the WSS office. An entry will be judged only at the time established by the contest organizer. The allowable turn in time will be five (5) minutes before, to five (5) minutes after the posted time.
9. Garnish is optional. Sauce is optional. If used, it shall be applied directly to the meat & not be pooled or puddled in the container.
10. Entries will be submitted in an approved WSS numbered container provided by the contest organizer. Containers shall not be marked in any way so as to make the container unique or identifiable.
11. The following cleanliness & safety rules will apply:
 - Excessive use of alcoholic beverages or public intoxication with disturbance.
 - Serving alcoholic beverages to the general public.
 - Use of illegal controlled substances.
 - Foul, abusive, or unacceptable language, or any language causing disturbance.
 - Fighting and/or disorderly conduct.
 - Theft, dishonesty, cheating, use of prohibited meats, or any act involving moral turpitude.
 - Violation of any WSS rules above.

CAUSES FOR DISQUALIFICATION & EVICTION of a team, its members & guests.

- Excessive use of alcoholic beverages or public intoxication with disturbance.
- Serving alcoholic beverages to the general public.
- Use of illegal controlled substances.
- Foul, abusive, or unacceptable language, or any language causing disturbance.
- Fighting and/or disorderly conduct.
- Theft, dishonesty, cheating, use of prohibited meats, or any act involving moral turpitude.
- Violation of any WSS rules above.

JUDGING PROCEDURES.

- Blind judging only. Entries will be submitted in an approved WSS numbered container provided by the contest organizer.
- Judging will be done by a team of 3 persons.
- Each judge will first score all samples on appearance of the meat. The judge will then score on taste & tenderness, before moving to next entry.
- The score system is whole numbers from 9 to 2. 9 excellent, 8 very good, 7 above average, 6 average, 5 below average, 4 poor, 3 bad & 2 inedible.
- Total points per entry will determine the champion within each meat category.

NEXT GENERATION ANZAC BISCUIT COMPETITION

The Next Generation ANZAC Biscuit Competition is open for competitors aged between 18 and 40 years old as of 1st May in the year of competition.

This competition is a test of skills in the fine art of baking ANZAC biscuits. A set recipe is provided for exhibitors to use in accordance with the Queensland Ag Show rules. Competitors must use the supplied ANZAC biscuit recipe. Biscuits are to be 5cm in diameter.

Biscuits must be crisp.

4 biscuits are to be presented for judging.

The competition begins at the local show. Winners of the ANZAC biscuits at the local show competition are eligible to enter the Sub Chamber competition. The winner of each Sub Chamber is then eligible to be judged at the State Finals. Only one entry from each Sub-Chamber is permitted to enter the State Finals. State Finalists will have their ANZAC Biscuits displayed at the EKKA.

ANZAC BISCUIT RECIPE (INGREDIENTS FOR 24 BISCUITS):

- 125gm butter, chopped
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/2 tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- 3/4 cup desiccated coconut

Method: Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly. Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

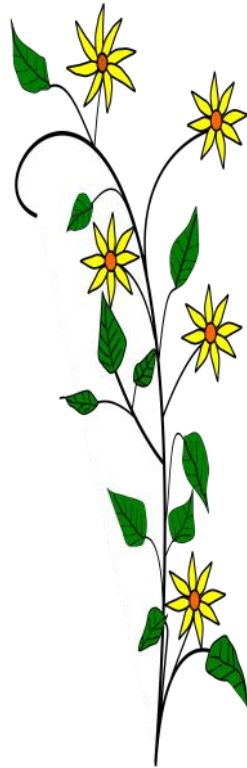
